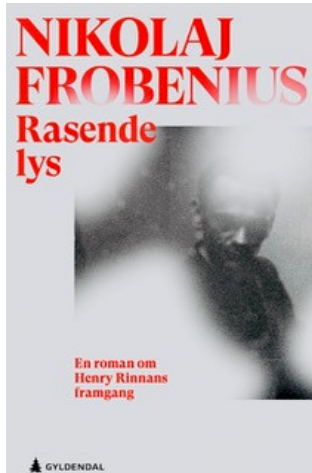


Nikolaj Frobenius
